WE WANT A DIFFERENT WORLD:

- A world where conflicts are resolved peacefully, not through war.
Therefore, general disarmament must occur, eliminating all "opposing" coalitions and promoting unions and supranational organizations that govern in the collective interest, particularly for problems that have become global;
- A world where climate change is addressed with immediate, effective, and permanent solutions. We need to prioritize environmental sustainability and the protection of our planet's lands, seas, and space;
- A world where social justice, for every person, all peoples, and ethnic minorities, in every field and at every level of human relations, is immediately planned and implemented;
- A world where the culture of "me" and "to have," which promotes individualism, conflict, material consumerism, and the pursuit of appearances, is replaced by the culture of "we" and "to be". A culture that promotes solidarity and cooperation in social relations for the greater interest of the common good, that assures self-fulfillment and joy in a balanced life, including one's contribution to collective progress, personal relationships, enjoying nature's beauty, arts, and culture, and healthy sports activities;
- A world where cultural evolution also brings about the vast financial availability necessary to support the development of the real economy and to promptly implement all the other innovations needed for this better world we envision;
- A world where such financial availability comes primarily from: public capital redirected from outdated investments (arms, wars, purely financial speculation, fossil fuel energy searches, etc.), the distribution of wealth based on equity and social justice, and from a radical and effective fight against corruption, tax evasion, and various forms of crime;
- A world where labor is recognized as the primary creator and owner of the wealth generated within enterprises. Consequently, we want support for labor to go hand in hand with public support for private initiatives, business creation, and development, with an extension of public guarantees to business financing. This guarantee will enable those who are currently excluded from entrepreneurship—particularly young people, the unemployed, and NEETs—to engage in business activities despite being unable to provide collateral. Furthermore, it will also encourage savings to move away from stagnant deposit accounts and reliance on large funds focused solely on financial speculation, redirecting instead—with appropriate returns—toward financing and developing the real economy and generating a cycle of positive effects as a result.

THIS IS THE WORLD WE WANT
AND WE WANT IT WITH YOU OR AGAINST YOU!

A better world for which no initiative is feasible while the above conflicts continue; These conflicts drag the entire globe into the risks of war, create enormous military and financial burdens, and produce harmful consequences for the global economy. Yet, this global involvement also authorizes

civil society to consider itself a stakeholder and have the right to intervene, to demand immediate diplomatic resolution of conflicts ...through the abandonment of preconditions that prevent conflict resolution and through the positive cooperation of all parties involved.

Unfortunately, this legitimate demand currently goes unheard by the states directly involved in the conflicts and by their respective supporters. Thus, civil society's right to intervene should go beyond unheeded peace requests but instead expand to a demand to actively engage on the global stage with its own proposals for mutually agreed conflict resolutions. Proposals that will demonstrate how mutual concessions can facilitate equitable agreements and, moreover, serve as a model for the necessary mechanism that replaces conflict and the pursuit of exclusive dominance with cooperation, opening a period of peace, security, and increasing well-being for all. Thus, we must demand that leaders listen, review, and be willing to implement such proposals. And, should they persist in ignoring this demand, civil society must act directly by creating in each State a political party that incorporates the better world we envision as part of its agenda, with the cessation of wars as its primary premise.

Civil society aligned with the aforementioned main principles and goals for a better world must:

- 1) Promote awareness of these principles and goals in every State, obtaining broad support from individuals, organizations, and associations with similar objectives and willing to cooperate;
- 2) Organize into a movement that, while allowing for unregistered participation, has a structure that allows democratic operation, including decision-making, collaborations, funding, and a detailed electoral program aligned with the aforementioned goals while respecting local peculiarities (as an example, see Italy's program, downloadable and printable in Italian and English on "civilsocietyleading.com");
- 3) Establish stable informational and cooperative contacts among all nations, enabling to assess the global scale of participation, arrive at mutually agreed-upon solutions to conflicts (one such solution, for the Russia-Ukraine conflict, is outlined and analyzed in the following text), agree on the recipients of these proposals, as well as coordinate simultaneous global demonstrations and any other joint initiatives to support concrete measures for achieving the other goals of the political-electoral program.

Proposed Solution for the Russia/Ukraine Conflict:

Conflicting interests include territorial claims (related to valuable areas such as seas, ports, nuclear plants, agricultural and mineral wealth), contrasting cultural and national identities, extensive military forces stationed along borders, and Russia's unfortunate attempt to resolve the issue through occupation. Numerous other countries are involved in the conflict for security reasons, interests, or geopolitical opportunities.

Determining a proposal capable of untangling this extensive web of conflict is only possible by shifting from a culture of conflict to one of cooperation, in order to achieve a general situation where, alongside the elimination of wars, threats, aggression, and fear, security is certain and stable for all; economic interests in the affected sectors find protection and significantly improved satisfaction, and predominant cultural and national identities find adequate consideration and resolution.

This cultural change is, first of all, the only evolution capable of unraveling this damaging global conflict, and it also becomes the essential foundation—both culturally and financially—for starting all the other innovations required to achieve that BETTER WORLD WE DESIRE in all its previously described essential aspects.

Therefore, the proposal must first and foremost envisage a ceasefire; with the UN entrusted with the task of effectively freezing the respective military conditions and actions. Subsequently, all States should be convened at the UN to seek and define a general agreement. An agreement that would

first and foremost eliminate, on a global military level, occupations, fears, and threats of attacks, and even the very possibility of promoting a war.

Then, an agreement should be reached to dissolve both NATO and any other existing military enhancement agreements, even if declared to be purely defensive; with the understanding that only a supranational entity—the UN?—would have ownership and control of both nuclear and conventional weapons and ammunition, for any future need arising from the use of military force in the interest of the entire community. Consequently, it is understood that each individual state would not possess nuclear weapons and would maintain a military force solely for internal public order and for possible participation in actions at the request of the supranational entity. . Moreover, every State would retain the right to scientific and technological research in the military field, but on behalf of and under the supervision of the supranational entity.

As for borders, an agreement would initially restore Crimea and separatist southern regions within Ukraine's boundaries while granting these areas specific administrative autonomy and advantageous conditions for neighboring countries in maritime rights and agricultural, energy, and mineral resources.

In terms of cultural and national interests, the agreement would provide for minority rights, bilingualism, and, after 3 or 4 years, allow Crimea and the southern regions to decide, via a UN-supervised referendum, whether to remain within Ukraine with these privileges, assume full sovereignty, or join Russia; in the latter case, all the preferential treatments already provided for their territories would be transferred to Ukraine.

The benefits for all States of such an agreement are immediately apparent: cooperation, stable security, and the immediate availability of the immense sums diverted from the financing of wars and armaments would relaunch economies, foster true globalization, and provide for services that have thus far been sacrificed. Moreover, the triumph of cooperation over conflict and of sociality over competitive individualism would finally allow for the financial and cultural resources to assign to supranational entities all sectors of the better world that require management at such a level, with the task of dictating and controlling the lines and goals to be pursued, with implementing measures that take into account local needs and peculiarities while simultaneously always responding to the higher interest of the common good.

In conclusion, today it is up to civil society to take the initiative; therefore, individuals, associations, and entities motivated toward the same vision and supporting the above program should come forward, engage in dialogue on the proposal, and address organizational needs that support the program's progression.

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
